

Coverage from 1860 to the present encompasses the full range of sub-disciplines in art, design, and architecture, chronicling pivotal movements, events, debates, and individuals.






Art and Architecture Archive (1860-2015) is a valuable resource for scholars of 20th-century art, design, and architecture. It offers access to visually rich consumer and trade magazines that document key developments, industry news, and artworks, which are often absent from

scholarly journals. The archive features major magazines from around the world, many available digitally for the first time.

Highlighted publications include: Architectural Review, British Journal of Photography, Graphis, Print, Goya, Popular Photography, Building Design, ID and Preservation

Art and Architecture in Video



Art and Architecture in Video, an online streaming film collection, offers documentaries and interviews illustrating the theory and practice of a variety of art forms and providing the context necessary for critical analysis. The resource spans period and region, including coverage of the

Renaissance, Neoclassicism, Romanticism, Modernism, and Contemporary art. In addition to art history and theory, the collection addresses applied topics such as architectural and graphic design.

Highlighted selections include:

- *Icons of 20th Century Design*, a series that analyses the conception and impact of world-renowned design elements for companies such as Coca Cola and Volkswagen.
- Sculptures of the Louvre, a series highlighting the famed museum's great masterpieces and their historical contexts. (Available in the US only.)


The Artforum Archive



The Artforum Archive spans over six decades of contemporary art coverage, featuring influential writing, original artwork, and critical commentary. It includes contributions from major artists and critics, documenting key movements and cultural developments. The archive

supports research, teaching, and creative exploration across art, media, and cultural history.

Country Life Archive



A comprehensive archive (1897 to 2005) of the weekly British culture and lifestyle magazine, *Country Life*, which focuses on fine art and architecture, the great country houses, society news, and rural living. This British popular magazine serves as an important record of the changing ownership and

appearance of the United Kingdom's great houses, sometimes serving as the only source for restoration and recreation of early 20th-century structures and interior designs. With significant coverage of not only art and art history, but also pursuits relevant to its audience, such as equestrian news, landscaping, hunting, and shooting, this archive illustrates a unique and rich piece of UK history and culture.

The House Beautiful Archive



The House Beautiful Archive offers comprehensive access to over 125 years of content, covering interior design, home life, and lifestyle trends. It serves as a key resource for studying the evolution of domestic architecture, social dynamics, and cultural influences. The archive

provides valuable insights into 20th and 21st-century art, design, and family life, documenting shifts in style, technology, and societal norms.
