## **Empowering Research and Facilitating Understanding**

Great Series and Reports empowers users to conduct research on timely topics with a historical context. The current and historic content is archived together so all years are always accessible and searchable from the same place. The opportunity to make connections between executive branch documents and related legislative content allows users to understand better the relationship between the two branches of government. Users will be able to retrieve content using harmonized subject terms, agency names, and legislative terms. Links between related predecessor and successor series enable users to track changes in content over time. Links between issuing agencies and predecessor and successor agencies enable users to find related content and better understand changes in Federal agency organization.

This new product facilitates the building of a collection of executive branch documents, historic to present, including complete series, and makes available newly digitized documents not available elsewhere. The content and the functionality to work with the content will facilitate teaching and learning about the implementation of laws and governmental policies, and changes in executive branch organization over time.
