
Periodicals Index Online (PIO)



Periodicals Index Online (PIO) provides a multidisciplinary index to journal backfiles in the arts, humanities, and social sciences from 1665 to the present. Complete runs of titles are indexed, from first issues to recent times. It simplifies the discovery of primary and secondary sources,

allowing users to search across three centuries of periodical archives. This index includes over 10,000 journals, providing an invaluable tool for literature reviews and scholarship.
