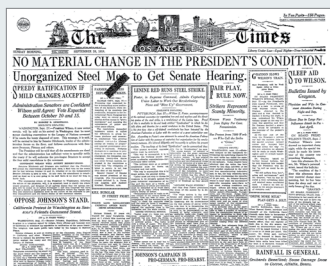

# About the Historical Newspaper Titles in U.S. Major Dailies



## The New York Times (1851-2021+)

Known as “America’s newspaper” for more than a century, *The New York Times* has commanded a sizable international readership. The world news and personal stories captured by this Pulitzer Prize-winning newspaper for over 170 years provides historical insight on timely topics including politics, immigration, science and technology, globalization, health and medicine, international conflicts and much more.

## The Wall Street Journal (1889-2013+)

Originally known as the Customers’ Afternoon Letter, *The Wall Street Journal* chronicles the development of industries and companies, as well as the implementation and consequences of fiscal policies on the global economy, over the course of more than a century. A valuable research resource, especially for students studying business, finance, economics, and journalism.

## The Washington Post (1877-2008+)

The first newspaper in Washington to publish seven days a week, *The Washington Post*’s early contributors include Joseph Pulitzer and a relatively unknown, un-biased Theodore Roosevelt. This publication is known for its comprehensive political reporting, first-rate photo essays, Pulitzer Prize-winning editorial writing and unmatched investigative journalism.

## Los Angeles Times (1881-2016+)

The development of Southern California and the American West is chronicled in the *Los Angeles Times* through coverage of topics and events including the building of the first railway to connect the coasts; immigration; agriculture; the birth of Hollywood; and the travels of reporter Charles Lummis who walked from Cincinnati to Los Angeles, recording his journey to provide a unique glimpse into Native American life.

## Chicago Tribune (1849-2015+)

Best known for its prize-winning investigative and public service journalism, the *Chicago Tribune* provides historical coverage of people and events critical to the evolution of the Midwest, including social reform of the Progressive Era at the turn of the 20th century, immigration, organized crime and political corruption, industrialization, manufacturing and more.
