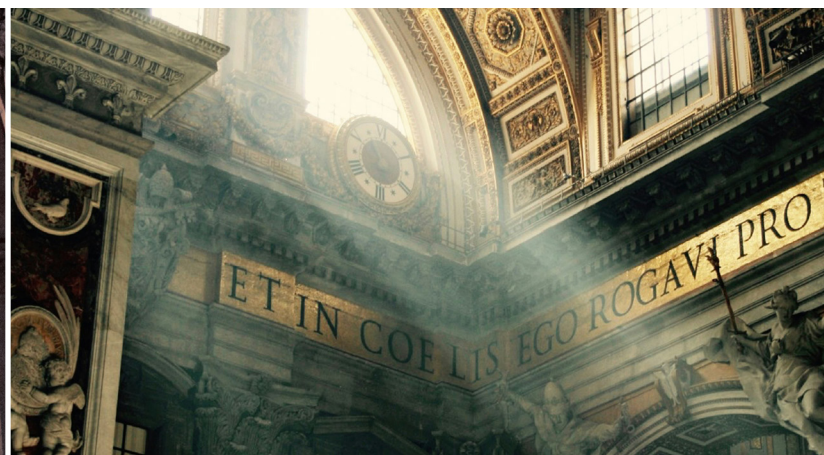

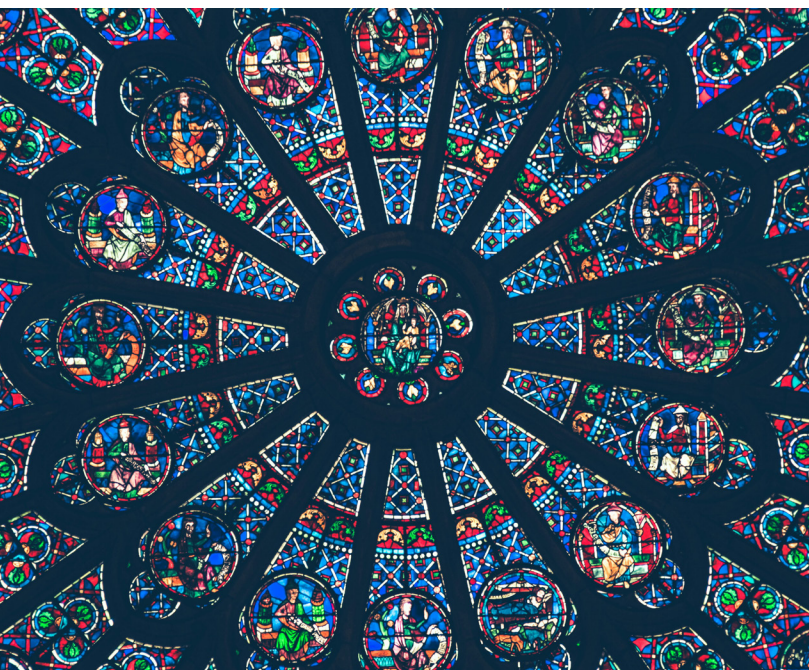

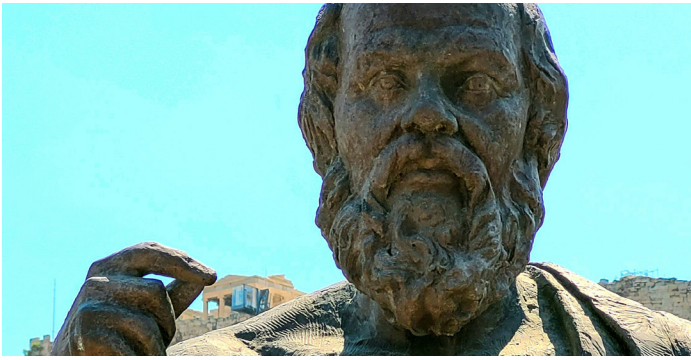

Religion Archive Collection

Brings together 12 expansive and unique primary source collections that collectively trace the evolution of religious thought, theological scholarship, and philosophical inquiry across centuries and traditions. It includes:

- **Acta Sanctorum:** Acta Sanctorum (or 'Deeds of the Saints') is a principal source for research into the societies and cultures of early Christian and medieval Europe providing information on the lives of the saints and every aspect of life from the beginning of the Christian era to the end of the sixteenth century.
- **The Bible in English:** 20 different versions of the English Bible, including 12 full Bibles, five New Testament texts, two versions of the Gospels only, and William Tyndale's translations of the Pentateuch, Jonah, and the New Testament.
- **Digital Library of Classic Protestant Texts:** A vast collection of seminal works from the Reformation and post-Reformation eras, enabling in-depth research into the religious and social upheavals of the 16th and 17th centuries.
- **Digital Library of the Catholic Reformation:** a treasury of theological writings, biblical commentaries, confessional documents, social and political works, sermons, letters, polemical treatises, and other key documents from this critical epoch in European history.
- **Luthers Werke:** This complete Weimar edition of Luther's writings is one of the largest editions ever by a single author comprising more than 117 volumes in quarto format. An indispensable historical-critical tool for theologians and historians, linguists and literary scholars.
- **The Patrologia Latina:** All 221 volumes of the first edition of Jacques-Paul Migne's Patrologia Latina (1844-1855 and 1862-1865), a huge collection of the writings of the Church Fathers and other ecclesiastical writers.
- **Religious Magazine Archive:** Religious magazines originally aimed at a popular readership are key primary sources through which to interpret myriad aspects of 20th-century religious history. Religious Magazine Archive provides access to the archival runs of 18 major religious consumer periodicals.
- **Twentieth Century Religious Thought Library:**
 - **Vol I, Christianity:** With 150,000 pages of scholarship, this resource provides unprecedented access to the diverse ideas that have shaped understandings of Christianity across history
 - **Vol II, Islam:** Thousands of pages of foundational texts and contextual monographs from the late 19th century to the 2010s
 - **Vol III, Judaism:** the most important works and primary sources that document the evolution of Judaism from the 1890s-2010s including many unpublished primary sources and difficult-to-find texts and authors.
 - **Vol IV, Eastern Religions:** presents the evolution of eastern religion through the seminal works of major religious thinkers in Buddhism, Hinduism, Taoism, and Jainism.
 - **Vol V, Religion in Video:** This unique collection of religious films and documentaries provides a deeper understanding of the social and political context surrounding practicing religion in the modern era.





Philosophy Research Collection

A full-text journal database specifically designed for researchers of all aspects of the interdisciplinary field of Philosophy. Content covers the period 1860 to the present and is updated on a regular basis with new issues and new journal titles. Researchers require access to modern and historical full text journal content and are, in greater numbers, consulting contemporary dissertations to conduct their studies.

Religion Collection

Provides a broad range of primarily full-text international periodicals including scholarly journals, content from religious publishers, nondenominational organizations, newspapers, trade journals, and magazines to support the study of both traditional and contemporary trends in religion.

It Includes 280 full text scholarly journals from providers such as Springer Nature, Cambridge University Press, and Johns Hopkins University Press and covers formal theological studies and commentary on topics of general interest from the perspectives of specific religions.
