Founded by legendary producer Quincy Jones, VIBE was the premier publication for US hip-hop for over two decades, serving as the authoritative source for hip-hop culture. VIBE was renowned for its groundbreaking contribution to the mainstream recognition and coverage of hip-hop culture, and for elevating the profiles of numerous influential hip-hop and R&B artists. This archive addresses the scarcity of digital primary sources for the study of hip-hop culture and is an essential resource for tracing the history and evolution of this musical genre and its associated cultural elements. In addition to its coverage of hip-hop and urban culture, this archive provides a different perspective on various aspects of popular culture and lifestyle, including film and television, fashion, style, food, beverages, health, beauty, travel, and technology.
